
6th Grade Courses

- History (regular or intensified)
- Disciplinary Literacy (regular or intensified)
- Math (recommendations made over the summer - will not choose math at this time)
- Health & PE
- Elective

Dotted line progressions indicate that these instances are less common.


6th Grade Intensified Course Options

- Available for English, Disciplinary Literacy (reading), Science, and Social Studies
- Increased rigor
- Consider if you want to be challenged and dig deeper in the subject
- Optional! You can take 0, 1, 2, 3, or 4 intensified classes.
- Any student can register. You do NOT need a teacher recommendation.
- Choosing to take a regular or intensified option does not determine course placement for future school years.

Comparing the Courses





Cover the same content standards

General introduces topics and provides exploration into ideas.


General guides students to use critical thinking and analytical skills with structured support.

Intensified engages students to apply and investigate content to personal interests.


Intensified is for students who want to "nerd out" in a content area.

General provides students opportunities to investigate the content related to the real-world.

General is for students who enjoy a topic but it is not their passion.

Rising 6th Grade 26-27 Course Request Form (Swanson) Due February 20th

This form allows families to choose their classes for 6th grade.

Families will choose English, science, history, Disciplinary Literacy, and elective classes. All students will take Health & Physical Education.

You will not choose a math course at this time. Math placement recommendations will be made prior to the end of the school year. A letter noting the recommended course will be sent home to families before final assignment is made.

Intensified Course Options: Intensified classes are open to all students. If your student is designated as gifted in the content area where an intensified course is offered, we recommend choosing the intensified option as gifted clustering will only happen in intensified courses. We understand that course selection is a family decision.

Act II Classes

- Weekly elective class
- 1 day per week - after school
- Attendance is taken and students receive a grade
- Offerings change each year based on staffing availability
- Recent classes have included Theater Arts and Band

Check-In (Extended Day)

- After-school care from 2:35-6:00 PM
- Register through APS Extended Day office for a fee
- Activities are self-directed
- Students can participate in sports, clubs, ACT II classes, and other activities during this time.

Transition Activities

- Counselors will visit elementary schools present to 5th grade students in late January/early February
- Rising 6th Grade Course Information Night - February 10th
- 5th graders will visit Swanson in April
- Summer Tours/Info Sessions - Dates TBD
- Rising 6th Grade Open House in August 27th*
